
OUR MISSION




OUR HISTORY

The historic Valentine Theatre opened its doors on Christmas Day in 1895 and is currently a 901-seat facility operated by the Toledo Cultural Arts Center, Inc. Following a 21year effort by the Board of Trustees and the community, the newly renovated theatre was reopened on October 9, 1999. Since then, more than a million people have attended international, national and regional presentations, weddings and events.






















STORYTIME, SESSIONS, AND SCHOOL DAYS KICK OFF VIRTUAL SEASON!

Since our last newsletter, there has been a flurry of activity at the Valentine. Thanks to generous grants from Buckeye Broadband, Marathon Classic, and The Greater Toledo Community Foundation, as well as returning sponsorships from PNC, The Andersons, Inc., Owens Corning, Owens-Illinois, and many more, we have been able to maintain operations at the Valentine and expand our virtual programming. Technical Director Tim Durham and Assistant Tech Director Joshua Smith have finished filming a dozen episodes of the newest

addition to our educational outreach programming, Story Time at the Valentine, featuring an impressive lineup of notable community members reading remarkable children's books from our Main Stage. Readers include Toledo Mayor Wade Kapszukiewicz, former Mayor and State Fire Marshal, Mike Bell, City Councilwoman Dr. Cecilia Adams, local veterinarian John Dillon, former Valentine Theatre Board Chair, Jim White, to name just a few. Tim and Josh have also started filming Sessions, which highlights area artists performing



in intimate ensemble groups on the Valentine's Main Stage. Filming of THE Modern Dance Company recently wrapped. Please watch our website and Facebook page to see when additional Sessions performances will be posted.

Area educators and homeschool families will be happy to learn that Valentine School Days returns December 1 with virtual performances available for viewing via our website. Musical favorite, The Chicken Dance, presented by ArtsPower will start the season. 

IN MEMORIAM JOHN "JODY" PALSA

It is with a heavy heart that we share the news that John "Jody" "Hacksaw" Palsa the Business Manager for the IATSE Local 24 passed away on June 16, 2020, at the age of 61. Jody held the office of President for 3 years and the office of Business Agent for 9 years. His service included contract negotiations and enforcement and securing stage crew members for all the local union houses. He also assisted as needed in Detroit, Findlay and other locales. Jody's life was spent in service to the entertainment industry. He worked with all the rock-and-roll greats who came through our area, as well as

the professional Broadway touring companies and spent many a night working at the Huntington during hockey season.

Many years ago we sat down with Jody and his membership representatives from IATSE to share the plight of the local not for profits who were striving to maintain operations in financially difficult times. A stronger partnership was forged when it was announced that IATSE would relax some of their rules and regulations regarding the number of mandatory workers for the educational programming at the Valentine and would allow students (primarily high school) to work alongside the union workers and the Valentine tech staff to learn the art of theatre technology. This agreement allowed the Valentine the ability to increase its educational outreach significantly.

The not for profit relies on the strength of its partnerships and the Valentine is proud of the strong partnership it has with IATSE 24. Contract negotiations are always a challenge but every three years we sat down with Jody and his crew and created a contract that benefited all of those involved and that was fair and inclusive for all participants.

We mourn the loss of Jody and listening to the stories of his son, whom he loved to talk about! When the theatre finally opens again it will be without one of its shining stars.
